

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U-MULTIRANK 2021

U-Multirank is a unique, multidimensional and international ranking of higher education institutions. It compares university performance across teaching and learning, research, knowledge transfer, international orientation and regional engagement. It is the largest and most inclusive ranking showcasing the diversity in higher education around the world. It is not a league table and does not use composite indicators, nor reputation weights. Therefore, there is no one best university in U-Multirank. The performance of a university is presented with individual scores - graded from 'A' (very good) to 'E' (weak) across the different areas.



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AT A GLANCE: HOW DO FRENCH UNIVERSITIES FARE IN U-MULTIRANK?

- With regard to U-Multirank's five performance dimensions, French institutions perform strongest in the dimensions International Orientation and Teaching & Learning: In both dimensions more than 70% of all indicator scores of French institutions are ranked into group 'A' (very good) or 'B' (good).
- 17 French institutions reached a top group position ('A' score) in more than ten indicators. This includes business schools and technical universities/institutions, comprehensive institutions as well as an institution specialised in the Social Sciences.
- 26 French institutions have more than ten top group positions ('A' score), seven have even more than 15.
- Top performing French institutions are: École Centrale de Nantes (19 'A' scores), IMT Atlantique (17), AgroParisTech (16), Grenoble Ecole de Management (16), Télécom Paris (16), TelecomSudParis (16) and Touluse INP (16).
- French institutions achieved 18 global 'Top 25 Performers' positions across four indicators: In Student Mobility, French institutions count for 8 out of the 25 global top performers; in our new Collaboration Index, 7 French universities are ranked among the top 25, 2 are listed on Co-publications with Industrial Partners and one in International Joint Publications.



WHICH ARE THE TOP PERFORMING UNIVERSITIES IN FRANCE?

École Centrale de Nantes received the highest number of 'A' (very good) scores on the institutional level for France in 2021.




HOW DO FRENCH UNIVERSITIES PERFORM GLOBALLY?

Above or below average?

WHAT IS U-MULTIRANK?

U-Multirank is a multidimensional, user-driven approach to international ranking of higher education institutions. It compares the performances of higher education institutions – in short: universities – in the five dimensions of university activity:

(1) teaching and learning, (2) research, (3) knowledge transfer, (4) international orientation and (5) regional engagement.

The U-Multirank web tool enables comparisons at the level of the university as a whole and at the level of specific study programmes. Based on empirical data, U-Multirank compares institutions with similar institutional profiles ('like-with-like') and allows users to develop their own personalised rankings by selecting indicators in terms of their own preferences.

Based on the results of a feasibility study covering 150 universities which was carried out in 2010/11, the European Commission decided to fund the implementation of U-Multirank. This roll out is carried out by a consortium led by Professor Frans van Vught of the Center for Higher Education Policy Studies (CHEPS), University of Twente in the Netherlands and Professor Frank Ziegele of the Centre for Higher Education (CHE) in Germany as well as the Centre for Science and Technology Studies (CWTS) from Leiden University and Fundacion CYD. U-Multirank is funded by the European Commission, the Bertelsmann Foundation and Banco Santander. The consortium also works closely with a range of national ranking partners and stakeholder organisations.

The work of the U-Multirank consortium is overseen by an Advisory Board.
